# **Survey Updates**

- Judge Krothe, Judge Stafford, and Judge Fawcett presented findings: <u>Judicial Branch Survey</u>
  - Survey included responses from Judges, Court Services, Court Reporters, Bailiffs, and Probation.

# **Survey Topics**

- Desired Features for a New Jail
- Comments on What Works Well- 53 responses
- Concerns about the Jail- 66 responses
- Features to Consider- 52 responses
- Co- Location- average of 79.6 out of 82 responses
  - This question was asked relative to co-location with the jail, not co-location with each other.
- Features to Include in a New Campus- average of 80.5 out of 82 responses

Survey needs to be done of jail staff and medical providers working in the jail.

## **Jail Design and Construction**

## Land Update

- Fullerton Pike property was denied the request for rezoning by the City Council on 12/21/2022.
- Thompson property (Catalent) is not being considered.
  - Limited access
  - Sirens may be disruptive to youth shelter
- Collaboration
  - Committee should collaborate to come up with possible land options to present to the Commissioners.
  - o Members of committee encouraged more collaboration with the city.
    - Land recently used for Bloomington hospital/warehouses.
    - Vacant multi block area near B- line (Close to Centerstone)
  - o Members of committee encouraged placing more importance on community input.
- Jails are discovering they should not locate in downtown areas.
  - o Evidence on this will be shared with committee members.

# **Phoenix Trip Update**

Not discussed. Commissioners will prepare a written report on this item.

#### **Committee Collaboration**

- Almost all court hearings are public- Judge Stafford encouraged committee members and the
  public to attend. Prosecutor's office and Public Defender's Office are also open for members of
  the committee to visit.
- Multiple committee members requested more transparency around activities (trips, events, etc.) to allow for more involvement and input.
- Judge Stafford reminded the committee of the importance of victims of violent and non-violent crime.
- Commissioner Thomas compared the committee to lanes of a road, in that each member has their own area of expertise and their own part of the process
- Councilor Crossley requested that the committee gather input from inmates and their families.
  - o Allison Howlett- IU Behavioral Health Institute
    - A survey of people in jail and their families; people in jail would be surveyed again after leaving jail.
    - Survey is intended to hear about their experience while in the jail.
      - What programming worked/ helped? What other programming could we do?
- Commissioner Jones stated that the current concern is locating property for a jail.
  - o Eventually we will want a justice campus.
  - o Intention for co-location
    - Sheriff department and some court offices should be moved to the new jail location in the first phase.

- Commissioners will prepare a written report on the Phoenix, AZ trip for the next meeting.
- Commissioner Jones is hoping to schedule a Zoom meeting with the Crisis Recovery Center in Tucson.

### **Public Comment**

## **Isabel Piedmont-Smith: Bloomington City Council**

- The city would like to help in any way that they can.
- How do the Commissioners view the roadmap of this process? When do they want input, and from whom?
- Any location should be served by public transit, which is under the City Council's control.
- The lane analogy that was discussed at this meeting did not encourage collaboration.
- The city is hopeful they can be more involved through active engagement.

## Kaisa Goodman: City of Bloomington's Public Engagement Director

- Main questions for the CJRC:
  - How does the CJRC plan to prevent people from going to jail, improve outcomes, reduce recidivism, and increase quality of life for those incarcerated?
  - What capital improvements are most feasible and beneficial to improve conditions for those in custody?
- Committee should be discussing increased services and support systems in the present tense, not future.
- Community justice reform is a public health issue.
- Committee should be prioritizing immediate implementation of services, prevention, and diversion efforts.
  - Make significant local investments in mental health, substance abuse, and job placement.
- If there was a plan for the jail decided now, it would still take years to implement. What does this mean for people that are currently in the jail?
- Bringing the city to the table will improve the process and outcome.

## **Sidney Foreman: Care not Cages**

• Expert opinions are important- but so are the opinions of those in the community and those inside the jail.

## Haley Powell: IU Law Student

- Director for Administration for the Incarcerated Individuals Legal Assistance project.
- Reminded the committee to be mindful of the human compassion aspect of this issue.
- Jails don't disappear social problems, they disappear people.

# Missy James: New Leaf New Life

- Shared a story of a recent client that was released in the middle of the night which resulted in a bad case of frostbite. They had to be taken to the hospital before any treatment could be done.
  - o Where/ when you are released can be the difference between making it or not.
