To Whom It May Concern:

The Indiana Department of Transportation, with federal funding, intends to proceed with a project involving the aforementioned small structure in Monroe County. This letter is part of the early coordination phase of the environmental review process. We are requesting comments from your area of expertise regarding any possible environmental effects associated with this project. **Please use the above designation number and description** in your reply. We will incorporate your comments into a study of the project's environmental impacts.

The proposed project is located on SR 48 over Unnamed Tributary (UNT) to Richland Creek, 2.34 miles east of SR 43 in Monroe County, Indiana. This section of SR 48 is classified as a Rural Minor Arterial and consists of one 11' lane in each direction with no paved shoulders. A ditch is present on the south side of SR 48 that drains into the small structure. The existing structure is an approximately 60' long, 5' diameter Corrugated Metal Pipe (CMP). A small block wingwall is present on the south end of the pipe. The project need is due to the deterioration of the structure (rating 4 out of 9) which is in poor condition. The purpose is to have a structure with a condition rating of at least 7 (good condition) out of 9.

The proposed project is anticipated to replace the existing structure with a 5' diameter reinforced concrete pipe (RCP) with 6" of sump. Riprap is anticipated to be needed. No guardrail is anticipated since the ends of the culvert should be extended beyond the obstruction free zone. The project will require the acquisition of permanent right-of-way. The proposed maintenance of traffic is anticipated to require an official state detour. Tree clearing will be required on the north and south side of SR 48 to allow for construction. The project is anticipated to begin construction in Spring 2026.

Land use in the vicinity of the project is primarily rural, with woods to the north and residential to the south. Coordination with the INDOT Environmental Services-Ecological and Waterway Permitting will occur. This project is anticipated to qualify for the Rangewide Programmatic Agreement for the Indiana bat and northern long-eared bat by completing the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC). Coordination will occur

with INDOT Cultural Resources Office (CRO) to evaluate the project area for archaeological and historic resources and for Section 106 compliance. The results of this investigation will be forwarded to the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) for review and concurrence as appropriate.

However, should you find that an extension to the response time is necessary, a reasonable amount may be granted upon request. 




