ORDINANCE 2018 - 21

An ordinance to amend Chapter 230 of the Monroe County Code

WHEREAS, Chapter 230 of the Monroe County Code (MCC) addresses the creation, membership, terms and duties of the Monroe County Women's Commission; and,

WHEREAS, the current members of the Women's Commission have discussed and would like to recommend amendments to the membership terms of the Women's Commission, which is addressed in MCC 230-2; and,

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Board of Commissioners ("Commissioners") agree that the amended language clarifies and enhances MCC 230 and, as such, they support and wish to approve the recommended changes and additions to MCC 230-2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners, as follows:

**Section 1.**

Chapter 230-2 of the Monroe County Code shall be and, hereby, is amended as follows. Underlined language is to be added and ~~struckthrough language~~ is to be deleted.

**230-2. Membership and Terms**

The Commission shall have ~~up to~~ eleven (11) members who shall represent diverse professional areas, including, but not limited to, women's affairs, gender studies, education at all levels, non-profit development, healthcare, the justice system and the arts. Strong preference shall be given to persons living outside the corporate limits of the City of Bloomington, and to those with expertise or demonstrated interest in County government. The members shall be appointed as follows:

(A) Four (4) citizen members chosen by the County Board of Commissioners, residing in geographically separate areas of Monroe County from other citizen members appointed by the Board of Commissioners, with no more than one (1) member residing within the corporate limits of the City of Bloomington.

(B) ~~Three (3)~~ Four (4) citizen members chosen by the County Council, residing in geographically separate areas of Monroe County from other citizen members appointed by the County Council, with no more than ~~one (1)~~ two (2) members residing within the City limits of the City of Bloomington.

(C) One (1) ~~ex-officio non-voting~~ member from the County Board of Commissioners or an employee of Monroe County chosen by the Board of Commissioners.

(D) One ~~(1) ex-officio non-voting~~ member from the County Council or an employee of Monroe County chosen by the County Council.

(E) One ~~(1)~~ member from the City of Bloomington Commission on the Status of Women, as chosen by that Commission.

~~(F) One member representing Indiana University chosen by the Director of the University's Office of Women's Affairs.~~

**Section 2.**

This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.
