The project was bid with traffic being maintained on Old SR 37 Line S-1-A with temporary widening being constructed and the road section being completed in two phases 1A and 1B. See plan sheets 12 and 13 for bid phasing at this location. However, in the field the utility of Center Point high pressure gas was found to be in conflict with the temporary widening along the west side of Old SR 37 and there was not enough right of way for further relocation.

The time frame to relocate the utility would have been months and caused further delays. This change order adds Portable Signals to allow for construction and widening of Old SR 37 to maintain a single lane of traffic 24 hours a day or 7 days a week. See attached sketch of portable signal set up. Portable Traffic Signals are the only viable option with the area constraints and high traffic volume. The total cost

impact of this change order is a savings to the contract as Temporary Pavement Markings, Construction Signs, and Line Removal are all being decreased with the change.

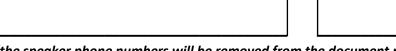

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made between Monroe County Youth Services Bureau ("YSB") and People and Animal Learning Services, Inc. ("Contractor"). This MOU sets the terms and understandings that each party has mutually agreed to:

The terms of the Agreement enlist PALS, as a contractor, to provide unmounted equine activities at the PALS facility located at 7644 West Elwren Road Bloomington, Indiana,. The following terms shall apply:

- 1. **Background:** Contractor seeks to partner with YSB to provide quality equine-assisted services for clients who are currently enrolled in YSB.
- 2. <u>Scope of services</u>: Contractor agrees to provide up to two (2) group sessions (for up to 10 youths) per week at designated times to be determined mutually by YSB and Contractor.
  - a. Contractor will provide instruction based on lesson plans that focuses upon an initial classroom instruction based upon a horse-related topic and ties into the groundwork for each lesson. The group lesson will then focus upon grooming and groundwork that connects the kids with horses to establish the human horse bond.
  - b. Contractor's instruction will incorporate the Equipt curriculum which will focus upon the following topics:
    - i. Caring for Another/Horse markings;
    - ii. Trust/horse colors;
    - iii. Patience/horse behavior;
    - iv. Trust from Others/horse body parts;
    - v. Approaching Problems/horse feelings;
    - vi. Body Language/herd behavior;
    - vii. Being Present; and
    - viii. Fear
  - c. Contractor agrees to provide unmounted therapeutic programs with horses that is structured to accomplish the following objectives:
    - i. Promote joy, quality of life, better health, and empowerment.
    - ii. Provide new and enriching services to YSB clients in an environment that is caring, safe, and challenging.
    - iii. Provide YSB clients the opportunity to learn how to build trusting relationships, control impulses, and receive and reflect upon immediate feedback from horse(s) thus learning more about themselves and how their actions affect others.
    - iv. Provide YSB clients the opportunity to reach their highest potential by fostering growth, self-confidence, and individual achievements.
  - d. A PATH certified instruction employed by Contractor, will accomplish the above goals, by providing instruction that will allow YSB clients to develop an understanding of the following activities and/or concepts:

- i. Grooming and interacting with a horse from the ground (unmounted);
- ii. Forming a bond and learning how to communicate with a horse;
- iii. Leading horses;
- iv. Receiving and reflecting on immediate feedback from horse; and
- v. Learning about horses.
- e. YSB will provide staff to assist with supervision of YSB clients during Contractor programming. YSB shall be responsible for transportation of YBS clients to and from PALS facility. YSB will cover all costs incurred for transportation related fees to and from the PALS facility.
- 3. <u>Social Media</u>. Both parties to this agreement mutually agree that Contractor will be allowed to share information about the partnership on Contractor's social media accounts with the understanding that the names of participating YSB clients shall not be shared and that photographs shared shall not reveal the identity of and/or faces of YSB clients. Photographs of the horses, Contractor's staff and volunteers are permitted.
- 4. **<u>Reporting</u>**. Attendance of YSB clients and number of clients per session will be recorded by Contractor to track the number of clients served for billing and grant purpose. YSB clients will complete an anonymous pre- and post- survey that gauges emotional state before and after PALS session.

YSB and Contractor can meet at the end of each session (Spring, Summer, Fall, and/or Winter) as needed to discuss program progress and to re view the effectiveness of the program.

5. <u>Term and Price.</u> This special programming is being supported by funding from the Sophia Travis Community Services Grant Award and a Donor. The grant funds will support a commitment to providing twenty-eight (28) one (1) hour-weekly sessions at the rate of \$250 per session. These twenty-eight (28) sessions will be provided to YSB at no cost, provided the cancellation policy is followed.

The MOU is intended for twenty-eight (28) consecutive one (1) hour weekly group ground sessions for up to ten (10) YSB participants. The sessions will occur after the date of execution of this Agreement and before the end of the calendar year of 2024. No programming will be scheduled during the holidays.

After the twenty-eight (28) sessions have been used and additional funding has been sourced, parties may extend MOU in accordance with Section 7 of this Agreement.

Contractor shall submit invoices, including the time and dates worked, and a detailed description of the work performed. Invoices can be submitted to Vanessa Schmidt, Monroe County Youth Services Bureau, Deputy Director, at <u>vschmidt@co.monroe.in.us</u> and/or 615 S Adams St, Bloomington, IN 47403. YSB shall pay Contractor's submitted invoices within forty-five (45) days of receipt.

6. <u>Cancellation Policy for Sessions</u>. Contractor strives to provide quality programming and has reserved time, staffing, horses, and resources to provide our services to your organization. If you do not show up for your scheduled session time, the full cost to provide the one (1) hour of service (\$250) will be charged for non-attendance or less than 24 hours' notice of cancellation. 24 hours is determined by your appointment time. (If your appointment is at 5:00 pm on Wednesday, it needs to be canceled by 5:00 pm on Tuesday.)

By signing this MOU, YSB agrees to the following cancellation policy:

- a) The authorized representative of the group, as designated in the company information form, will email attendance@palstherapy.org 24 hours prior to the lesson, the number of participants that will be attending the session.
- b) During the 10 weeks of programming, YSB will begiven two excused absences. An excused absence requires a 24-hour notice of cancellation prior to the scheduled session. Cancellations must be sent to attendance@palstherapy.org.
- c) Emergency cancellations will be considered on a case-by-case basis and must constitute a true emergency.

Contractor reserves the right to cancel lessons due to extreme heat, cold, poor air quality, or severe weather. Contractor will make every effort to do so as early as possible. Cancelled lessons will be rescheduled at the mutual agreement of the parties.

- 7. <u>Modification and Termination</u>. This Agreement may only be modified mutually, including but not limited to an extension of term, and any modification must be in writing and approved in the same manner as this Agreement. This agreement may be terminated by either party by giving to the other, a (30) day notice in writing in advance of the intended date of termination.

9. <u>Liability Insurance</u>. YSB will provide Contractor with a certificate of liability insurance. Contractor shall purchase and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance in amounts of at least One (1) million per occurrence, and Two (2) million dollars aggregate, and furnish proof of such insurance to Monroe County before commencement of work on a project. Failure to provide this certificate may be regarded by Monroe County, in its, sole discretion, as a material breach of this Agreement, and may result in its cancellation without further cause. It shall be in Monroe County's sole discretion whether there is a material breach under this paragraph and whether the breach should result in cancellation of this Agreement.

- 10. <u>Liability waiver</u>. Clients that are enrolled in the YSB program are eligible to participate in PALS programming. Prior to visiting PALS, all YSB participants must have a signed liability waiver, and waivers must be provided to Contractor.
- 11. <u>Non-discrimination</u>. In the performance of work under this contract, it is agreed that Contractor, any of its subcontractors, or any person acting on their behalf shall not, in any manner, discriminate against or intimidate any employee or job applicant with respect to his hire, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment, or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of his race, religion, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, housing status, or status as a veteran – or discriminate by reason of such factors, against any citizen of the State of Indiana who is qualified and available to perform the work.

Contractor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations. Contractor has been made aware of Monroe County's policy on non-discrimination and agrees to comply with the policy. In addition, Contractor has been made aware of the Monroe County's policy prohibiting harassment in all regards, including, but not limited to, employment practices. Contractor agrees to make the Commissioners aware of any conduct which may violate any County policy including, but not limited to, the policies prohibiting discrimination and harassment.

- 12. <u>Compliance with Law</u>. Contractor shall comply with all State of Indiana and Monroe County applicable laws and regulations. Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless Monroe County for any fines or expenses of any nature which it might incur from Contractor's noncompliance. Contractor will comply with IC 22-5-1.7 et seq. Specifically including the following:
  - Contractor to enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all newly hired employees of the Contractor through the E-Verify program.
  - Contractor is not required to verify the work eligibility status of all newly hired employees of the Contractor through the E-Verify program, if the E-Verify program no longer exists.
  - Contractor must sign an affidavit affirming that Contractor does not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien.
- 13. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. - 14. <u>Captions</u>. The captions of the Agreement are for convenience only, and do not in any way limit or amplify its terms.

- 15. <u>Governing Law</u>. This agreement shall be governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana. The venue for any litigation resulting from or related to this Agreement shall be Monroe County, Indiana.
- 16. **Entirety of Agreement.** This Agreement, consisting of five (5) pages, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may be modified only in writing referencing this Agreement and signed by both parties.
